



Creation of Working Groups

NCEL launched issue specific working groups to increase members' opportunities for collaboration. These groups are designed to provide monthly meetings for legislators to get together, share ideas, and learn from one another. NCEL also launched an online community platform, Hivebrite, to organize legislators and allow them to remain in contact with each other, view resources, and share ideas.



Conservation

Legislators advanced wildlifie protections across the country in 2020, including the passage of new wildlife corridor bills and more states banning wildlife trafficking. The COVID-19 pandemic caused a lot of legislator interest in wildlife diseases. NCEL has hosted multiple briefings on the topic and developed new resources.



2020 Issue Spotlights

Climate and Energy

NCEL continued working with legislators on coastal protections and offshore drilling legislation leading to the passage of one bill. NCEL brought together legislators in the Southwest region to outline a joint energy strategy for the future. This convening inspired similar work in the Mid-Atlantic region. Staff continues to educate legislators on carbon pricing and the Transportation and Climate Initiative (TCI).




Environmental Health

Plastic pollution remained a major focus throughout 2020 with victories such as the comprehensive ban in New Jersey. NCEL started an extended producer responsibility (EPR) for packaging network and is coordinating a group of legislators looking to introduce legislation. NCEL is continuing to increase its work and focus on environmental justice in all program areas.



2020 National Forum

On August 6-7, 140 state legislators from 36 states convened online for NCEL's 2020 National Forum. The event provided state lawmakers the opportunity to collaborate on policy solutions related to environmental justice, climate, energy, conservation, and environmental health.



This year's National Forum featured multiple sessions on environmental justice and ensuring that policies benefit communities equitably. Former Department of Interior Secretary Ken Salazar delivered a keynote address on how conservation and environmental issues intersect with social justice, economic recovery, and much more. Secretary Salazar also focused on the importance of bipartisan cooperation in securing a healthy environment for all.

Other session topics included circular economy, PFAS toxic chemicals, sustainable food systems, habitat connectivity, 30×30 land conservation, utility planning, and more. The forum also featured a session on reducing single-use plastics, which included an addressby Senator Tom Udall, author of the Break Free From Plastic Pollution Act (BFFPA). He emphasized the crucial role states play and how state action to reduce plastic pollution spurred and provided blueprints for the introduction of the federal BFFPA.

NCEL Annual Award Winners

During the event, NCEL presented its annual Rising Environmental Leader and Environmental Achievement Awards. The Rising Environmental Leader Award recognizes outstanding environmental leadership in a first- or second-term legislator. Named for NCEL's founder, the Leon G. Billings Environmental Achievement Award celebrates legislative careers noted for extensive environmental success and impact.


