

Throughout 2023, NCEL saw growth and internal change as we strengthened our position as the go-to organization for state lawmakers seeking to learn and collaborate on environmental policy. After serving as NCEL's Deputy Director for the past five years, I officially took over as Executive Director in April. Since the transition, I have been working closely with the NCEL board and staff to develop new systems and processes that can prepare our organization for the future.

In addition to leadership changes, NCEL staff have worked throughout 2023 to grow our organization's impact. We launched a partnership with Native Americans in Philanthropy (NAP) to enhance collaboration between philanthropic funders, Tribal leaders, and state officials. NCEL staff developed new resources to aid our members in their policy efforts such as the Zero Waste Policy Roadmap, Outdoor Opportunity Toolkit, Utility Briefing Book, and more. We held 62 in-person and virtual events covering a range of trending environmental topics, with an increase in regional convenings to promote cross-state collaboration. And we continued to build out our new Ocean Program through meetings with NCEL's Coastal Working Group and in-person events.

Thank you to all of the members of our caucus for your tireless work on environmental solutions in 2023. As we approach 2024, our team is more committed than ever to assisting you with your legislative efforts. We look forward to working with you in the new year!

Climate & Energy

NCEL's Climate and Energy team expanded efforts in 2023 to assist legislators in advancing climate-smart electric utility policy. We released a comprehensive Utility Briefing

Book to equip legislators with the strategies needed to transition to a clean grid, launched an explainer blog series on the country's various regional energy systems, and hosted a Southwest Transmission
and Energy Convening for key legislative champions throughout the region. NCEL also organized more than 230 lawmakers from 43 states to call on the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) to strengthen its regional transmission planning rule; the letter received responses from FERC Chairman Willie Phillips and Commissioner Allison Clements, who shared their appreciation for the legislators and a commitment to incorporating their suggestions into the final rule.



Conservation
Outdoor engagement, biodiversity conservation, and state-Tribal conservation
partnerships were the primary focuses in 2023 for the Conservation team. Our new outdoor policy
staff expanded offerings for the Outdoor Working Group and released new resources including the
Outdoors as a Climate Solution Briefing Book and the Outdoor Opportunity Legislative Toolkit. In
June, NCEL launched a new partnership with Native Americans in Philanthropy (NAP) to enhance
collaboration between philanthropic funders, Tribal leaders, and state officials. NCEL coordinated
efforts on biodiversity conservation through webinars, working group sessions, sign-on letters, and
direct assistance to legislators working on endangered species, wildlife connectivity, pollinator
protection, zoonotic disease, and more.



Environmental HealthNCEL expanded support for state lawmakers throughout the country working to improve the health of communities this year, including through the elimination of plastic pollution. In addition to hosting regular briefings for the Plastic Pollution Working Group, we released our new Zero Waste Policy Roadmap which was developed in consultation with three other organizations to give lawmakers the tools they need to comprehensively and equitably address plastic pollution. NCEL's Mississippi River Legislative Caucus, which added 19 members in 2023, continued to provide hands-on opportunities for legislators to strengthen the health of the Mississippi River, including the immersive River Tour in June and the annual MRLC Forum in October.



Ocean 2023 marked the first year with a dedicated NCEL Oceans program. The new program helps to build the capacity of legislators representing coastal areas through engagement with NCEL's Coastal Working Group, in-person events, and other resources. In November, NCEL hosted an event at the Seattle Aquarium for legislative leaders from Washington, Oregon, and California to discuss and strategize on regional coastal issues. Virtual events included webinars on offshore wind opportunities for the East Coast and how to debunk offshore wind misinformation.

One Big Thing: Federal Engagement & Collaboration

In response to historic environmental action at the federal level in the past few years, NCEL staff continued to support state legislators in leveraging federal investments and improving state-federal collaboration. NCEL staff provided support through new digital resources, hosting events, and meeting with legislators to share policy ideas and lessons learned. The support NCEL has provided is specifically aimed at helping state lawmakers take advantage of federal environmental programs such as the Justice40 Initiative, Inflation Reduction Act funding, and the America the Beautiful conservation program.

Legislators Meet in Indianapolis to Ensure a Healthy Environment

On August 10-12, NCEL held its <u>2023 National Forum</u> in Indianapolis, Indiana, providing over 100 state legislators from 39 states and territories the opportunity to collaborate on policy solutions related to climate, energy, conservation, and environmental health.

With a continued focus on equitable and high-impact environmental policy, the NCEL 2023 Forum featured an opening plenary session on state-Tribal collaboration and two keynote speakers: Henk Rogers, founder of Blue Planet Alliance, and Janet McCabe, Deputy Administrator of the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. Other topics covered during Forum sessions included climate-friendly utility policy, plastic pollution, emerging energy technologies, coastal conservation, biodiversity, reducing dependence on toxic chemicals, and more.

In addition to the formal sessions, this year's Forum consisted of two evening receptions, as well as pre- and post-Forum convenings. NCEL held a pre-Forum session to help legislators in the PJM and MISO regions transition their grids and utilities to renewable energy. Following the Forum, legislators walked to Indianapolis' Waterfront Pavilion where they heard from Indiana Representative Cary Hamilton and Dr. Elan Pochedley on outdoor policy as access, equity, and climate solutions. After the panel, the local REI store provided e-bikes for attendees to test out along the Indiana Cultural Trail.

State Laws for Endangered and Threatened Species

The Natural Legacy for the Future report synthesizes insights from state wildlife agency personnel across the country to provide case studies and strategies states can implement to recover wildlife species and habitats. View the resource.

The Outdoor Opportunity Toolkit was created to provide state legislators, agency staff, and partners with a framework for establishing state-level outdoor opportunity funds and grant programs, which increase outdoor access for underserved youth and their families. View the resource.





NCEL continues to grow its budget sustainably year-over-year. In 2023, NCEL's budget grew to over \$2,500,000 — a 24% increase compared to 2022. We intend to grow our budget and our impact even further in the coming years.
